Bikeability

Every year, we run Level 1-3 Bikeability sessions for groups of Year 5 and 6 children (these were formally known as 'cycling proficiency') During the sessions, the children are taught not only to improve their cycling skills, but are also given the skills to be safe on busy roads. **For their own safety, children are only allowed to ride their bikes to/from school (and keep their bikes in school) once they have passed their Bikeability tests.** Please ensure that your child wears a cycle helmet – should an accident happen, cycle helmets can reduce the risk of a serious brain injury by up to 88%.



