Dear Parents/Carers,

**WELCOME BACK!** It has been wonderful to see all of the children back in school. Did you all receive your 'Spotlight On...' letters in the summer holidays? An extra-special Woodhall welcome to all of our new families – both in Early Years and those who have joined other year groups too. We talk to the children all of the time about being part of our 'Woodhall Family' and this includes parents, carers, staff and governors too. **Woodhall is a school that feels like home, with staff that feel like family and where children are not just educated, they are nurtured.** Many of you have already expressed your personal worries around the current economic crisis and what the future might bring. Like a family, we will support each other through challenging times. If you are struggling, please come and talk to us. We have many exciting things planned for this term. Over the next few weeks, we will be adding an all-new assembly rota and updated enrichment maps to our school website as well as a parents' version of our School Development Plan, which outlines our aims for this academic year and beyond. We are also reintroducing face-to-face parent consultations and themed class assemblies. Lots to look forward to!

## COMMUNICATION

We have a range of means by which you can talk to your child's class teacher. Teachers are available at home time when they lead their classes out. You can email teachers (alongside this newsletter, you will receive a leaflet entitled 'Who's Who at Woodhall' which contains teachers' email addresses) or contact the school office and ask that the teacher phones you – please bear in mind that phone calls will be made after school. For any concerns about your child's learning, behaviour or home issues, please contact the class teacher in the first instance.

Information regarding attendance procedures is sent home regularly. If your child is going to be absent, please inform Sue/Nikki in the morning or email [attendance@woodhall.herts.sch.uk](mailto:attendance@woodhall.herts.sch.uk).

Medical information should be shared with Sue or Nikki in the school office either by talking to them on the school gate in the morning or phoning the school on 0208 428 3447. Where appropriate (for example, if your child needs a detailed medical plan), a member of our SENCo team may contact you. If your child needs medication in school for a set time period, we will ask you to complete the relevant permission form.

We have an 'open door' approach at Woodhall. It is always better to talk about any worries or concerns that you have so that we can find a solution together. Equally, if you have something positive to say, then we would love to hear it!

### **FREE SCHOOL MEALS**

All children in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 are entitled to a free school lunch. This is via government funding known as 'universal free school meals'. **HOWEVER, if you are in receipt of particular benefits, you can register for free school meals, which covers children from Reception up to Year 6.** Registering means that the school receives an amount of pupil premium funding which helps to pay for learning resources as well as potentially subsidising school trips and clubs.

### **ASSEMBLIES AT WOODHALL**



Have you ever thought about what a school assembly consists of at Woodhall? We plan our assemblies very carefully to ensure that we are offering enriching experiences, collective worship and promoting children's social, emotional and mental well-being. National/international events such as Anti-bullying Week, Fair Trade Fortnight etc. and notable religious celebrations such as Diwali and Advent are built into our rota, as well as special days such as 'Children in Need'. We have a spotlight on safeguarding every half-term, where we cover a variety of areas such as online safety, protective behaviours, bullying etc.

Accompanying music is carefully considered, with the children walking in and out of the hall to a piece of music fitting with the week's theme and building children's knowledge and enjoyment of important artists/groups. We love singing at Woodhall, and once a week the school comes together for a singing assembly (this half-term, we are learning 'Lean on Me by Bill Withers').

At Woodhall, we take huge pride in the success and achievements of every single child. Each Friday we hold our celebration assembly, where certificates and awards are given for both academic and pastoral success. We also love to celebrate children's achievements out of school, so if your child has won an award or is doing something extra-special, please let us know so that we can all celebrate together!

Visitors are warmly welcome at Woodhall, and last year we had a wide variety of brilliant people who came to talk to the children...our MP, local councillors, local police, local churches etc. Do you know anyone who might be a great person to talk to the children (either in class or assembly)? This could be on a personal (e.g. sharing aspects of a religion, or home language, or culture) or professional (talking about a job) basis. Please let me know!

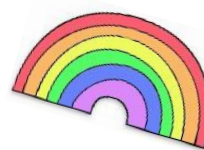
