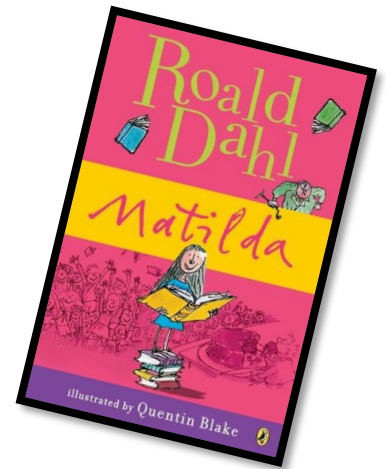




SPOTLIGHT ON...
