What are our next steps (based on your responses)?

Woodhall School makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year/ Woodhall lets me know how my child is doing.

We are discussing ways to improve this. Currently we publish curriculum plans and curriculum outlines on
our website, hold termly consultation evenings. Parents can (and do) email teachers whenever needed. We
have reintroduced class assemblies. We hold parent workshops although turnout has been poor and we will
think about how to improve this. An open evening ('Window into Woodhall' – where all parents/carers can
see their child's classroom/books, talk to the teacher etc.) is planned. In the spring term (January), we will
introduce an after-school classroom session where teachers will talk to parents about the learning for the
term

Woodhall School has high expectations for my child.

 During the spring term after-school classroom session, teachers will talk to parents/carers about age-appropriate levels in each subject, and show examples of this.

When I have raised concerns with the school, they have been dealt with properly.

- Any concerns raised are dealt with promptly and we endeavour to communicate effectively with parents/carers. Staff at Woodhall are highly 'visible' at the gate, at pick-up, via email.
- If you would like to raise a concern, the first thing to do is to contact your child's class teacher. Very often, concerns can be discussed with the teacher and are resolved quickly. Sometimes, the class teacher may pass your concern to a member of the Senior Leadership Team which includes one of our SENCos, Mrs Raithatha. Whatever the concern, it is important that we approach it as a team to ensure the best possible outcome for your child.

My child can take part in clubs and activities at Woodhall.

Please see the information on clubs in this newsletter. We have tried to introduce a Breakfast Club, but take-up wasn't sufficient to make this possible (only 3 children would have attended). Your feedback at the time was that our soft start gave parents plenty of time to drop children off before getting to their own work place. However, we are absolutely willing to try this

THIS HALF TERM'S WORKSHOPS

Following our workshops on the curriculum, reading and phonics last half-term; we have a workshop on Special Educational Needs/Disabilities (SEND) on Tuesday 8th November, 2-3pm. Mrs Raithatha and Miss Jones will give you an overview of SEND processes as well as advice on how to support your SEND child at home.

Following this workshop, we will be setting up a regular coffee morning for parents/carers of children with SEND in the spring term.

ATTENDANCE STARS AWARD

This week, we have started our 'Attendance Stars' award. Each Friday, children will be able to colour in one star on their class chart if they have been in school, on time (by 8.50am), every day. Stars mean points, and points mean prizes!



As outlined in the letter sent out before half-term week, we will hold a 'Magic Monday' in January, when children will receive their prizes.

Children will be given a reward if they have managed to colour in at least 4 stars. If they manage to colour 5 stars, they will get an additional treat, 6 stars- another and if they colour in 7, they will get all the available treats.
